1) Debate Required number of speakers in favour / against the motion

None: No debate required Required majority to pass the motion

Majority: more than 50% of present delegations

2/3: more than 2/3 of present delegations

None: No vote required

When the point or motion can be made

D – allowed during debate

V – allowed during Voting Procedure

 $P: Procedural = matters \ regarding \ structure \ of \ committee \ session \ (voting, \ speaker's \ list/time, \ adjournment, \ etc.); \ no \ abstention$
