

Please present your application as **a single** PDF file (max. 20 pages, max. 5 MB in size). The first four pages should consist of the completed application form, immediately followed by your assignment (written essay). You may then include additional documents (such as references, testimonials, certificates etc.). Please note that applications comprising more than 20 pages, or submitted as files more than 5 MB in size, will not be processed.

Please pay careful attention to this format when naming the file: do not use square brackets for your application file, be sure to state your name before your first name and use the underscore correctly. This is absolutely necessary so that your application file can be sorted alphabetically properly.

Timeframe for submitting applications: May 8 to June 14, 2023

To be eligible for participation in the selection procedure, your application must be received by the latest deadline, the application form must be completed in full and the following documents must be attached to the application:

- Tabular curriculum vitae (signed)
- Certificates: university entrance qualification (e.g. Abitur, Fachabitur); where appropriate, vocational training certificates with employers' references; in the case of first-year Master's students, Bachelor's degree certificates
- Proof of **acceptance of a place on a degree course** (may be submitted **by July 7, 2023 at the latest**)
- Assignment: written essay (max. 1,000 words; see below)
- Other documentation supporting the information provided in your application.

Written essay

Honour Code at the FS – signed once and then forgotten?

As open communities, universities are a reflection of society. They are guided by a whole range of values that should be lived out in an exemplary manner: respect, responsibility, commitment, trust and cooperation - these are the core values of the Honour Code at Frankfurt School. We can experience these values being represented in our community every day and be proud of them: an expression of a real FS spirit.

Unfortunately, the opposite of this also exists. Cases of misconduct that violate not only the FS Honour Code but oftentimes the law, threaten to disrupt the well-being of our community. Instances of unacceptable behavior that call for especial attention include:

- Sexual harassment towards other students, staff or teaching staff
- Consumption and distribution of illegal drugs
- Racism
- Cheating in exams and scholarship applications
- Disrespect (e.g. parking in the disabled parking space)
- Use of violence and threats of physical violence
- Property damage
- Bullying among students
- Hatred and hate speech on social media

Suggest ways to improve the effectiveness and visibility of the Honour Code at the FS (700 words).

Write a total of 1,000 words (+/- 10). Please strictly adhere to this requirement. If your essay does not meet the quantitative requirements, it will not be graded.
