

Please note that applications comprising more than 20 pages, or submitted as files more than 5 MB in size, will not be processed.

Timeframe for submitting applications: April 18 to June 23, 2021

To be eligible for participation in the selection procedure, your application must be received by the latest deadline, the application form must be completed in full and the following documents must be attached to the application:

- Tabular curriculum vitae (signed)
- Certificates: university entrance qualification; where appropriate, vocational training certificates with employers' references; in the case of Master's students, Bachelor's degree certificates
- ToR Frankfurt School study programme
- Assignment: written essay (max. 1,500 words; see below)
- Other documentation supporting the information provided in your application.

Written essay

Nuclear energy as a solution to the problem of climate change?

35 years after the Chernobyl and ten years after the Fukushima nuclear disasters, almost everywhere in the world experts are thinking about whether the use of civilian nuclear power could make an important contribution to the fight against climate change. In a way, it is surprising that even environmentalists are now advocating the use of nuclear energy instead of fossil fuels.

In 2019, Fridays for Future founder Greta Thunberg announced in a widely noticed Facebook post that, although she is not a friend of nuclear power, it could still contribute a small part to a large, CO₂-free solution.

In Finland, where the Green Party is part of the government, the construction of a controversial reactor is being pushed forward. In the British Green Party there's a group called "Greens for nuclear energy". In Germany, pro-nuclear activists have taken part in the Fridays for Future demonstrations.

For many countries, such as France, USA, China, Russia, India or South Korea, nuclear power is an indispensable part of the national energy supply - not least with regard to climate change. The fact that Germany has withdrawn from nuclear power, but still gets a third of its electricity from fossil fuels, is believed in many places to be the wrong path in terms of climate policy.

Some experts put the problem in a nutshell: "We have to decide which is more threatening: climate change or the risks of nuclear power".

Assignment:

What is your personal opinion regarding the global and national energy supply (based on the country of your origin)? Can and should nuclear energy play a role - not least because of the pollution caused by climate-damaging fossil fuels?
